Seminar – Health care and patient safety, 6th July 2019



The seminar was inaugurated by the Chief Guest, Dr.Vandana K E, Professor, Department of Microbiology, Kasturba Medical College, Manipal. In her address, she emphasized the importance of nurses role in patient care and safety. Dr. Anice George, Dean, MCON, highlighted the importance of nurses' in the clinical field and emphasized on the competency required by the present nurses to face the challenges. Ms. Prima Jenevive Jyothi D'souza, Asst. Professor, MCON, Manipal had a session on "Medication Safety". Ms. Precilla Noronha, Infection Control Nurse spoke on "Infection Control" in hospital. Mr. Anil Raj A, Lecturer, MCON, delivered a talk on "Professional Etiquette. A total of 73 delegates participated in the seminar.



Program was organized by the Continuing Nursing Education committee of MCON Manipal. The chief guest was **Dr. C Mallikarjuna Rao**, Principal and Professor of Pharmacology, MCOPS, MAHE, Manipal. Children's day celebration

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

International Clinical Placement







