



### **President Testimonial**




# **General Secretary**


















#### **Qalam**

After a three-year-long hiatus, the Editorial Board of MCOPS hosted its annual event: Qalam. Gathering over a hundred participants from Manipal and Mangalore, Qalam was filled with exciting events focused on literature and language.

It took place on the 18th and 19th of March, 2023, in the classrooms of MMMC. Day one kickstarted with the inauguration ceremony. Dr Manesh Thomas, Qalam's Chief Guest, articulated the importance of writing, stating that "a pen can be used for destruction and construction." Ms Aarthika Srinivasan, the Chief Editor, addressed the participants with the significance of "Qalam" and delivered a vote of thanks.


Qalam ended with the valedictory event, where prizes were distributed to the winners, and certificates were given to the participants and judges. This marked the end of an incredibly successful event.

### The First Model United Nations by MAPS, MCOPS - An Overview

The Student Exchange Council of MAPS of Manipal College Of Pharmaceutical Sciences conducted its first-ever Model United Nations On the 15th of October 2022 at Melaka Manipal Medical College. The event started on a bright Saturday at 9:00 a.m. Many students from the university participated and appeared as delegates representing a vast diversity in the world. The event began with the event's inauguration by the esteemed guest Dr C Mallikarjuna Rao, The principal of MCOPS. Dr. Anup Naha, professor of pharmaceutics at MCOPS, and Dr. Shrinivas Hebbar, professor of pharmaceutics at MCOPS. SP Kar and Dr. Vasudev Shenoy were the chief guests at the event.

The chief guest was further felicitated, encouraged the students to perform well and feel immensely proud in representing their colleges, and suggested that good ethics, attitude, and passion are the keys to success. The start of the debate was marked by striking the gavel.

The discussion was held on "disease control in humanitarian emergencies," and the Committee assigned was the World Health Organization. The executive board consisted of Chairperson Asmit Agarwal, Cochairperson Hakka Madan, Vice-chairperson Stuti Khatuka, and Chelsea George, escorted to the chair.

The debate started with the attendance of each delegation and the announcement of the table of the plan. Then, the General speaker list was listed where the appointed countries, for the time being, gave speeches representing their country's beliefs and policies.

The actions/measures the government brought in controlling disease outbreaks, humanitarian crises, and battling the gaps in their healthcare system. A continuous dialogue of points of information, including facts and statements, was exchanged between the countries.

This was followed by the proposal of a moderated caucus by the delegates to discuss the situation of COVID-19. Discussions took place between the countries. At 12:30 p.m., the first session ended, the assembly was provided a break, and the start of session two was at 2:00 p.m. with the continuation of the general speaker's list. Session two consisted of a heated-up environment and debates between the countries, and all the delegates were filled with energy to represent.

A moderated caucus was passed on the measures taken by the countries to combat humanitarian emergencies, consuming the delegates' attention to put forward the policies their country took.

The second session ended at 5:00 p.m. by drafting two press releases through the partnership among countries to reach a standard solution. A total of 12 countries and six took part in drafting two press releases.

The voting of the releases took place, and the first press release was voted against by a sponsor country, which led to its failure. The second press release faced opposition from most nations, leading to no resolutions during the assembly.

Finally, the assembly ended by passing a motion to end the discussion, followed by the countries favouring voting.

At 6:30 p.m., the prize distribution took place in the presence of an esteemed guest, Dr.Anup Naha. Certificates were felicitated by the organizing committee for managing the whole event.

It was followed by recognition of the executive board and awarding them certificates for conducting the debate smoothly and maintaining diplomacy amongst the Committee. This was followed by the announcement of the best delegate, awarded to the delegate of the USA, Arijita Nanda. Special mentions were given to Delegates of the Swiss confederation Ajinkya Nikam and Yagya, Delegates of the Republic of France, Udisha Singh and Aarthika, and Delegates of Ukraine, Aditya Kannan and Smriti Rannore. Verbal mentions were given to delegates from China, Australia, Albania, Pakistan, Denmark, New Zealand, and the Dominican Republic.

The event ended with all the delegates learning professionalism and diplomacy, and everybody seemed to have enjoyed the event to the fullest.













#### **ENTER-PRIZE AND INNOVATE'23**

An inaugural ceremony for the Enter Prize and Innovate was held on Thursday, the 16th of February, 2023, at 5:30 p.m. at Melaka Manipal Medical College. Mr. Raviraj NS conducted the workshop, which focused on high-thinking discussions on differences in innovation/entrepreneurship, startup ecosystem, innovation index, fundraising basics, and MAHE's innovation ecosystem.

The workshop began with a quote stating, "Innovation is the implementation or creation of something new that has realized value to others." and "Entrepreneurship is the creation of economic value." India is among the top 20 startup ecosystems globally and ranked 19th in the global country-wise ranking for 2022. Moreover, Bengaluru has India's most robust startup ecosystem, standing 8th in global cities and No. 1 in South Asia. Discussions were held on who can become an innovator or an entrepreneur and factors like creativity, intellectual curiosity, intrinsic motivation, commitment and perseverance,

leadership qualities and the most critical factors for startup success: 14% funding, 24% business model, 28% ideas, 32% Team 42% timing.

The workshop covered topics from preparation to raising capital, including preparing a compelling pitch deck, preparing business plans, being a good storyteller, due diligence, exit plan strategies for primary vs. secondary shares, and MAHE's research ecosystem.

Lastly, it covered a short company overview of Stempeutics pvt, founded by Manipal group in 2006 and its leading products like Stempeucel, its co-development product agreements with pharmaceutical giants like Cipla and Alkem laboratories.

The workshop ended with sheer encouragement provided to all the attendees who took back utter knowledge, and the workshop ended on a good note. 


